Curriculum Topic: Prefixes

Teaching Point: A prefix is a letter or group of letters that can be added to the beginning of a root word. When added it changes the meaning of the word.



Example: **re** (prefix) added to **write** (root word) = **rewrite** (new word)

Note the following prefixes in the table below.

| Prefix | Meaning | Example |
|--------|------------------|------------------------|
| un- | not, opposite of | untied (not tied) |
| mis- | badly, wrongly | mistreat (treat badly) |
| pre- | before | prepay (to pay before) |
