Answers to your frequently asked questions

- Q1: What are the components of the Secondary Entrance Assessment (SEA)?
- A1: The SEA comprises three test papers in the following subjects:
 - English Language Arts Writing
 - English Language Arts
 - Mathematics

Q2: How are the subjects in the SEA scored and weighted?

A2: The subjects are scored and weighted as follows:

Subject	Maximum Raw Score	Weighting of the Standard
		Score
(i) English Language Arts Writing	20	40%
(ii) English Language Arts	64	60%
(iii) Mathematics	75	100%

* English Language Arts & Mathematics raw scores are further scaled out of 100. Then each raw score is converted to a standard score and weighted accordingly.

Q3: Who is responsible for the marking of the SEA Test papers?

A3: The Caribbean Examination Council (CXC) has the responsibility for constructing the test papers and scoring them under standardized conditions.

Q4: What is the process for placement?

- A4: Students' marks (raw scores) on all subjects are converted to standard scores which are then weighted and combined. The combined scores are used to assign students to one of the following types of secondary schools:
 - Government secondary schools
 - Government-assisted secondary schools
 - Private secondary schools
 - Junior Life Centres

Q5: What criteria is used to place students in secondary schools?

- A5: Students are assigned to secondary schools according to the following criteria:
 - Parent's choices
 - Student's performance by order of merit
 - Principal's 20% selection (Denominational schools)
 - Gender
 - Residence
 - Multiple birth

Q6: Where can I obtain information about my child's performance on the SEA?

A6: Each child will receive a <u>Student Performance</u> <u>Report</u> (See page 12) at his/her primary school. This report outlines his/her performance on each component of the assessment as well as how he/she performed in relation to other students who wrote the SEA.

This report must be kept safely.

Q7: Why are some students placed in schools not among their choices?

A7: Firstly, students are assigned to schools based on order of merit, choice and the intake of schools. If a student's score does not allow him/her to be placed in any one of his/her four choices, he/she is assigned to an available secondary school as close as possible to his/her residence.

Q8: Where do I obtain the registration date for the secondary school to which my child has been assigned?

A8: The date can be found on the Student Performance Report. Parents/Guardians are strongly advised to contact the secondary school for more specific details prior to the registration date.

Q9: What is required for registration of a student?

- A9: A parent/guardian must accompany the student to the school and provide the following information for the child:
 - Student Performance Report
 - Birth Certificate
 - Proof of citizenship if he/she is a national born outside of Trinidad and Tobago
 - Valid student permit and any relevant documents if he/she is a non-national
 - Any other information as requested by the school

Q10: What can I do if I am not satisfied with the placement of my child?

- A10: You may:
 - Request a review of the marks obtained
 - Request a transfer
 - Have the child repeat the SEA, once all criteria are met and there is available space at a primary school

Q11: How do I request a review of my child's scores?

- A11: Complete and return the **Request for Review Form** available at the Education District Office with responsibility for your child's primary school, <u>no</u> <u>later than five (5) working days after the release of</u> <u>the SEA results.</u>
 - A fee of **Barbados \$25**, will be charged for the review of each test paper.
 - Obtain a bank draft payable to the <u>"Registrar,</u> <u>Caribbean Examinations Council"</u> from any commercial bank and attach it to the Request for Review Form.
 - Results received from CXC, will be processed by the Ministry of Education and made available at the Education District Offices on a date to be announced.
 - The outcome of a review could result in one of the following:

(a) no change in scores, therefore, school assigned remains the same,

(b) change in scores but insufficient to change school assigned, and

(c) change in scores resulting in a change of school assigned.

Q12: How do I apply for a transfer for my child?

A12: On the day of registration, complete a Request for Transfer Form which will be available at the secondary school to which your child has been assigned.

A student must be registered at the assigned secondary school before being considered for a transfer.

Transfers are **NOT GUARANTEED**. It depends on the availability of places in the secondary school that has been requested. Note that all secondary schools received their full quota of students during the placement process.

The criteria used for transfer are as follows:

- Student's performance (merit)
- Change of address
- Medical condition that must be verified by a medical certificate and school records
- Special needs that must be supported by the relevant documentation

Release of transfer results will be available at the respective Education District Offices on a date to be announced.

Q13: What should I do if I decide not to allow my child to take up his/her place at the Secondary School?

A13: Complete the Parent Declaration Form, which is available at both the primary and secondary schools. Submit the form either to the principal of your primary school or to the principal of the secondary school to which the student was assigned.

> The Parent Declaration Form is confirmation that you have decided that your child will not be accepting the place in the secondary school to which he/she was assigned. A completed Parent Declaration Form is NOT a request for a transfer.

Failure to register at the secondary school assigned or submit a completed Parent Declaration Form will be interpreted as non-acceptance of the place and consequently it may be assigned to another student.

Q14: What criteria are used to determine which students will re-sit the SEA in 2022?

A14: Students who were born after August 31st, 2008 and whose average score was 30% or less in the 2021 SEA will be required to re-sit the exam.

Q15: Why is my child required to re-sit the SEA in 2022?

A15: Students who have scored 30% or less have not yet mastered the basic competencies of numeracy and literacy. In such cases the child needs additional assistance to prepare him/her for secondary education.

- Q16: Why has my child who is older than 13 years and who scored 30% or less, been placed in a Junior Life Centre?
- A16: Given your child's age and performance, he/she is better able to benefit from the remedial/alternative education programme that will be offered at a Junior Life Centre.

Q17: What are some of the challenges my child may face moving from primary to secondary school?

- A17: Some of the challenges are:
 - Learning new subjects skills
 - Managing time constructively
 - Travelling to and from new locations
 - Meeting and making new friends
 - Knowing and obeying new school rules
 - · Securing school books and other resources
 - Dealing with conflict
 - Managing money efficiently
 - Knowing the roles of the various school personnel e.g. Form Teacher, Dean of Discipline, and Guidance Officer

Q18: What challenges will my child face repeating Standard 5?

- A18: Some of the challenges include:
 - Coping with disappointment about the results
 - Re-adjusting to a new group of students
 - Improving performance level
 - Remaining focused while repeating lessons previously taught

Q19: What can I do if my child has serious emotional difficulty coping with the results?

 A19: Counselling assistance is available from the Student Support Services Division (SSSD) of the Ministry of Education. You may call the SSSD at 622-2181 ext. 1033-36, Monday to Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for further information.

Alternatively, you may seek counselling from a private practitioner.

Q20: Where can I find additional information about the SEA?

A20: You may visit the online platform of the Ministry of Education at moe.gov.tt, the official source for any additional information regarding the SEA.

 The Percentile Rank indicates the percentage of students who had scores the same or below the composite standard score of the student. Two ranks are provided: 1. NATIONAL for all students who wrote the SEA and ii <u>Male or Female</u> for the students by gender. 						
e.g. A student's percentile rank of 95 th (NATIONAL), indicates that 95% of all the students who wrote the SEA had scores the same or lower than the student's score. This also means that 5% of all the students scored higher than that student. Therefore, if 20,000 students wrote the SEA, at the 95 th percentile, approximately 19,000 scored the same or lower than that student or 1,000 students scored more than that student.						

- A. The name of the student who wrote the SEA.
- B. The identification number assigned to the student.
- C. The date of birth of the student.
- **D.** The **primary school code/name** where the student wrote the SEA.
- E. A table that indicates the **scores** obtained by the student in the subjects written for the SEA.
- F. The **Composite Standard Score** is used to rank and place students. It is determined by using a statistical formula applied to the actual scores.
- **G.** The **Percentile Rank** describes on a scale of 1 to 99, a student's relative standing in relation to the student population sitting the SEA. It gives an idea of approximately how many students scored the same or lower than the student's composite standard score.
- H. "National" indicates that among all the students who wrote the SEA, Siarra Sam scored at the 95th percentile. That meant that if 20,000 students wrote the SEA approximately 19,000 scored the same or less than her or 1000 students scored more than her.
- I. "Female" indicates that among all the female students who wrote the SEA, Siarra Sam scored at the 97th percentile. That meant that if 10,000 female students wrote the SEA approximately 9,700 scored the same or less than her or 300 female students scored more than her.
- J. The secondary school code/name to which the student was assigned.
- **K.** The date for the student to register at the secondary school.
