Topic: Outline of steps to prepare for extreme weather conditions.


Key Points:

• Weather is the atmospheric conditions at a particular place over a short period of time.

- Weather considers the following conditions of a place:
 - o temperature (hot or cold)
 - o the amount of wind
 - cloudiness
 - o precipitation (rain, snow, hail).
- Climate is the long-term average of weather or the weather pattern over a large region.
- **Severe weather** refers to any weather condition with the potential to cause damage, serious social disruption or loss of human life.
- Extreme weather conditions are unusually intense, harsh or unexpected
- Extreme weather events are increasing due to human-induced global warming
- Examples of severe or extreme weather in the tropics, such as Trinidad and Tobago are:
 - Storms and hurricanes
 - o Heat spells
 - Drought/ Dry spells
 - Funnel clouds
 - Thunderstorms
