The Geographical Location of the Caribbean

The Caribbean's Geographical Location

The location of the Caribbean is sometimes hard to pinpoint because of the technicalities surrounding the definition of "The Caribbean". These notes seek to break down those technicalities of what territories are considered to be truly a part of the Caribbean and why.

Mainland territories whose shores are washed by the Caribbean Sea **ARE** a part of the Caribbean!!

Where is the Caribbean Located?

The Caribbean is located both in the northern and western hemisphere. The overall area includes the Caribbean Sea and all its islands located in the southeast of the Gulf of Mexico, east of Central America and Mexico. Some mainland areas are also a part of the Caribbean because their shores are washed by the Caribbean Sea such as Honduras and Belize. The islands are bordered by the Atlantic Ocean.

Though the region is considered to be one large area it is further divided into sub-regions: Greater Antilles, Lesser Antilles, the Bahamas and Mainland areas. Below there are 2 maps: one showing the Caribbean as is and the other showing its sub-regions.

NB: The northern regions are also referred to as the Greater Antilles and the eastern region is also referred to as the Lesser Antilles. The western and southern regions are the Caribbean's mainland areas.
