Systems of production

After the Europeans realized that the Caribbean gold and silver deposits were done, the Spanish, English and French turned the Caribbean into places of agricultural enterprises. The planting of tobacco was replaced by the planting of sugar, starting from the 1640's. The large scale planting of sugar facilitated a large labour force. The Europeans eventually turned to enslaved Africans to develop and sustain the plantation economy that they had developed. When slavery ended in 1838 in the British Caribbean, the Europeans turned to indentured servants to maintain the plantation economy.



Slavery and indentureship maintained the plantation economy for more than 200 years
