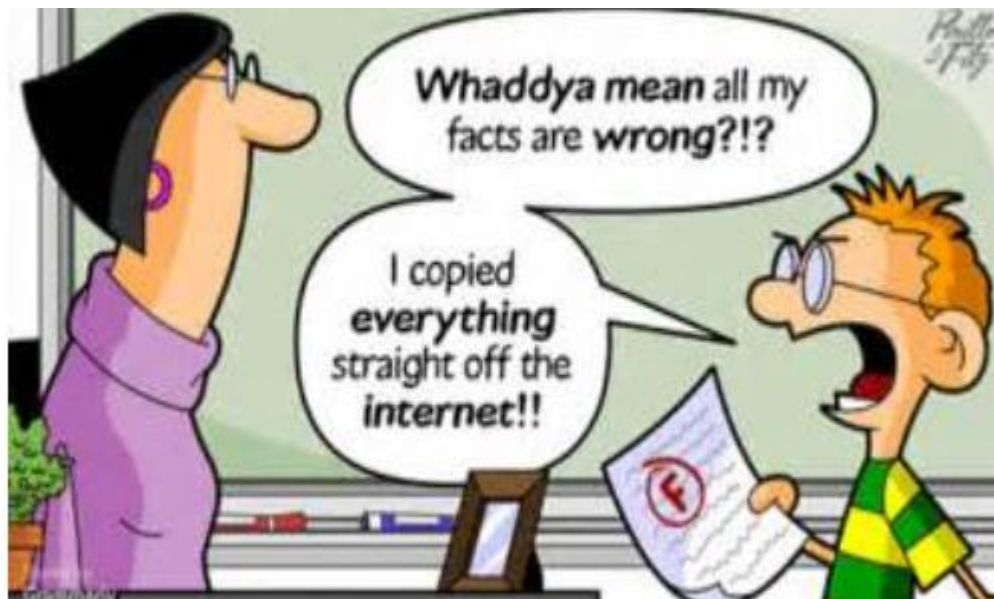


The importance of validity
