

Population Density

Population Density refers to the number of people living in a given area, generally the number of people per square kilometre. As described previously, the choropleth map is used to depict population density.

DID YOU KNOW! Land accounts for only a meagre 30% of the earth's surface, with 70% being water bodies. Additionally of the 30% of land it is suggested that only 11% is easily accessible and and presents few limitations to settlement and agricultural use.

Population density is calculated by dividing the total population of the region or country by the area of that country

Total Population (TP) /Area (KM)
