Age and Gender differences

The generation gap sometimes sees people from across generations operating from different viewpoints and sets of norms, mores and values. They can different language and also interpret things differently. In some cases, men and women have different priorities and different approaches to communication, which can lead to misinterpretation.

<u>Prejudices</u>

If a sender is prejudiced against an intended recipient, the tone of the message may be affected and may be negatively received.

Beliefs and ideology

A person's beliefs and ideology are very important to them. When communicating to a recipient with different beliefs, it is important not to make any assumptions about what they understand about the sender's beliefs. Showing respect for different beliefs and ideologies is equally important.

<u>Status</u>
