Regional Integration

- Regional Integration- Caribbean States working together to achieve better results for their economies. An example of Regional integration is CARICOM.
- The Caribbean Community (CARICOM) is a grouping of twenty countries: fifteen Member States and five Associate Members. Stretching from The Bahamas in the north to Suriname and Guyana in South America



Caribbean Community (CARICOM)

- CARICOM comprises states that are considered developing countries, and except for Belize, in Central America and Guyana and Suriname in South America, all Members and Associate Members are island states.
